Portrayed by Gerry Nicholas


Stagecoach driver who owned and operated the local mail route from San Diego to Temecula.

Wife & mother who, with her husband, Louis, owned the Little Temecula Rancho and the Wolf Store adobe.

Wife & mother who was the first Caucasian child born and raised in the Temecula valley.





Wife & mother, postmaster, and rancher born on Palomar mountain & lived most of her life in Aguanga.

JEAN BETHELL - 1902 - 2002 Portrayed by **Julie Gilbart**

Secretary to Erle Stanley Gardner, famous author of the Perry Mason mystery novels.

E. HALE CURRAN - 1900 - 1999 Portrayed by Mindy Johnson

Business woman who grew up in the Fountain House Hotel and was employed at Guenther's Murrieta Hot Springs Resort.
